#### **Helvitia Farm School:**

#### **Key Success:**

- Good working relations between Provincial Department of Health and Department of Education including other stakeholders
- Department of Education provide daily transport for all learners
- Sanitary Pads project initiated and supported by DOSD, DOE, DOH and Premier's office ( Check page 3)
- Stakeholders supported the school health campaign: Sports & recreation, SASSA, Home affairs. Lovelife, SAPS, Municipality and DOE & DOH District officials

## **Key Challenges:**

- Feeding scheme is not consistence and reliable
- No first aid kit
- Consent forms: language challenges
- Health centre for referral 35km away from school
- No mobile clinic visit the area.

#### **Recommendation:**

- Mobile clinic to visit the area
- First Aid Kit and training of teachers
- In-service training for teachers on basic health related matters
- IEC material on health related issues such as sexual and reproductive and nutrition posters and pamphlets
- Dedicated school health team and transport

DOE and DOH to re-visit the issue of the feeding scheme

### **Unicon Primary School (Farm boarding school):**

#### **Key success:**

- Dedicated school health teams
- Sanitary towel project roll out
- Support of the district Manager including Province

#### **Key Challenges:**

- Consent from not signed: language problem
- No dedicated/suitable transport for school team
- No treatment for minor ailments
- No relevant supporting documents e.g. Y&A Policy, surveys etc.

#### **Recommendations:**

- More health teams required
- Orientation workshop for nurses and educators
- IEC material: Local languages
- Treatment of minor ailments
- Strengthen parents involvement

# FREE STATE PROVINCE SANITARY PADS PROJECT

- 1. The Departments of Education, Health and Social Development partnership in this Project
- Launched by the Premier and MEC for Health during June 2011 responding to Minister's Budget Speech and Presidential Nation address
- 3. Service Providers Prota and Gamble (NGOs) has been identified to supply ? 5 000 learners for the next 3-years.( We'll double check the figures with the Province)
- 4. Situational analysis was conducted by three (3) Government Departments and criteria was developed e.g. Department of Education provided with the list OVS and schools.
- 5. Criteria
  - a) Rural Schools
  - b) Learners needs
  - c) Orphans
  - d) Puberty stage (menstruation)
- 6. Thabo Mofutsanyane District pfloted the project in eight (8) schools
- 7. Distribution strategic 4 months: stock for each learner (8 10 menstruation pads each) and the project has been rolled out in all districts.NB School nurses distributes the Sanitary towels to the school
- 8. This Project forms part of the School Health services packages.
- Type of pads chosen by youth in the pilot district: Stay Free, Max slims and Dry Wax Wings
- 10. Premier under the Operational Hlasela campaign in partnership with the communist youth league to roll out the project
- 11. Health budget/funding from strategic health programme
- 12. Minitoring done by: LoveLife and Prota and Gamble
