

Chairman or Deputy-Chairman, as the case may be, shall hold office for the unexpired period of office for which the person who originally vacated his seat as Chairman or Deputy-Chairman was elected.

(2) The Deputy-Chairman may be removed from office by resolution of the Territorial Authority.

PART V.

THE EXECUTIVE.

Executive administration to vest in an Executive Committee.

13. The executive administration of the Territorial Authority in regard to all powers, functions and duties of the Territorial Authority as prescribed by, or which may be delegated to the Territorial Authority by the State President, in terms of the Act shall vest in the Executive Committee which shall be elected from amongst the members of the Territorial Authority.

Constitution of Executive Committee.

14. (1) The Executive Committee shall consist of a Chief Executive Councillor (who shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee) and five other members, hereinafter referred to as Executive Councillors, of whom not less than four shall be chiefs.

(2) The Chief Executive Councillor and the Executive Councillors shall be elected by secret ballot as hereinafter provided.

(3) The Chief Executive Councillor and the Executive Councillors shall be responsible for the administration of the departments appearing in the Annexure to these regulations: Provided that the Minister may direct that two or more departments shall be combined and administered by one Executive Councillor.

Election of Chief Executive Councillor and Executive Councillors.

15. As soon as a Chairman and a Deputy-Chairman have been elected as in regulations 10 and 11 provided, the Territorial Authority shall proceed to the election of a Chief Executive Councillor and Executive Councillors.

Method of Election of Chief Executive Councillor.

16. The provisions of regulation 9 and 10(1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7) and (8) shall mutatis mutandis apply to the election of the Chief Executive Councillor save that the election shall, subject to the provisions
