 3 late. We were delayed by discussions we were having in
 4 chambers with the evidence leaders, some of them. You're
 5 still under oath, Major-General.
 6 WILLIAM MPEMBE: Yes, Chairperson.
 7 CHAIRPERSON: Mr Mpofu -
 8 MR MPOFU: Thank you, Chairperson, very
 9 briefly -
 10 CHAIRPERSON: Before you proceed with the
 11 cross-examination, as is your custom, I take it you wish to
 12 give us a situation report on what happened in the High
 13 Court yesterday.
 14 MR MPOFU: Thank you, Chairperson.
 15 CHAIRPERSON: Some of us may have read it
 16 in the newspaper, but it's probably appropriate that you
 17 should tell us here in the chamber so that it's on record.
 18 MR MPOFU: To put it on the record
 19 formally, Chairperson, yes. Well, happily, Chairperson, I
 20 finished my cross-examination, so I'll only do the
 21 situational appropriateness report for now. Chairperson,
 22 yes, the report that we promised you and the Commissioners
 23 on Tuesday is that indeed yesterday we went to court and we
 24 can safely report, Chairperson, that after, since we
 25 raised, Mr Ntsebeza and I raised the issue of funding on

1 the 1st of October last year, we can today announce that
 2 it's finally over. That long fight is over now in that
 3 yesterday an order was granted, two orders were granted;
 4 one was for granting the Legal Aid South Africa leave to
 5 appeal to the Supreme Court of Appeal, and simultaneously
 6 another order was granted in our favour, lifting the
 7 automatic suspension on the judgment which would otherwise
 8 follow the granting of the leave to appeal. In simple
 9 terms what that means is that the appeal will take its life
 10 in the SCA, probably might even end up in the
 11 Constitutional Court, we don't know, but from our point of
 12 view, as far as the Marikana Commission is concerned, Legal
 13 Aid South Africa will continue to pay for the legal
 14 assistance of our clients until the end of the Commission.
 15 So to that extent then it's a happy ending. Thank you very
 16 much, Chairperson. And we want to thank you, Chairperson -
 17 CHAIRPERSON: I'm sorry, until the end of
 18 the Commission or until the judgment is given? That's -
 19 MR MPOFU: Whichever comes first. I
 20 suspect we won't have to -
 21 CHAIRPERSON: I take it, I'm speaking on
 22 your behalf as well as my own, that I hope the Commission
 23 will have concluded its labours and given its report by
 24 that time.
 25 MR MPOFU: Yes, Chairperson, firstly we

3 while we are in exhibit marking mode, shall we mark it, it

4 will be HHH71, I take it?

5 MR BUDLENDER SC: We have a difficulty,

6 we understand this was on the hard drive, we are told by

7 our colleagues, but we don't have a copy, we don't know

8 where to find it, we can't follow the evidence.

9 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Mr Chairman, I think we

10 indicated, I think, was it on Tuesday, that the captain has

11 made a statement, not only that, I also spoke to my

12 colleague, Mr Wesley, I indicated to him that he should

13 give other parties notice that we are going to use this

14 statement.

15 CHAIRPERSON: Well, there appears to have

16 been some kind of slip twixt the cup and the lip on this

17 particular one, but I will tell you what we will do, we

18 will have another short adjournment. In fact, let's take

19 the tea adjournment now, and this whole question can be

20 sorted out during the tea adjournment and then we can come

21 back and proceed.

22 MR MATHIBEDI SC: Thanks, Mr Chairman.

 22 that's all we want" it looks as if that expression, phrase
 23 or clause "who is supposed to give us a response regarding
 24 the money the want" is a relative clause defining the
 25 umlungu of the mine. And it isn't actually a question, but

 2 and have heard the original will be able to tell us whether
