Abstract:	The collection consists of John Harris's trial records, police docket and prison files, and his
	Security Legislation Directorate (SLD) file kept by the Department of Justice, as well a media file,
	and a collection of letters written by John Harris to his sister whilst in prison. John Harris, a
	member of the African Resistance Movement (ARM), was sentenced to death and was hanged in
	1965 after detonating a bomb at the Johannesburg station on 24 July 1964 as an act of defiance
	against the apartheid regime in South Africa.

### Introduction

Frederick John Harris was the only white person to be hanged for a political offence during apartheid.

Born in 1937, teacher and sportsman John Harris, became actively involved in the Liberal Party of South Africa (LPSA) in 1960 and was soon elected to the National Committee. Soon afterwards he also became involved in the South African Nonracial Olympic Committee (Sanroc). As chairman of Sanroc he travelled to Switzerland in 1963 to testify at the International Olympic Committee (IOC), seeking South Africa's exclusion from the 1964 Tokyo Olympics because of its racially discriminatory sports policies. His passport was seized on his return, and a year later he was served with banning orders under the Suppression of Communism Act.

He joined the African Resistance Movement (ARM), a militant anti-apartheid resistance movement founded by members of the LPSA. From its first operation in September 1963 the ARM continued with the bombing of power lines, railroad tracks, roads, bridges and other vulnerable infrastructure until July 1964 without any civilian casualties.

On 24 July 1964 Harris planted the bomb at the Johannesburg train station, killing Ethel Rhys and injuring 23 people. He was arrested, following the confession by one of his colleagues, John Lloyd. Harris was convicted of murder and hanged on 1 April 1965, aged 27.

### **Related Materials**

### Notes on the Collection

Materials comprising the John Harris collection consist of Harris's police docket, trial records, prison and media files donated by his son David Wolfe; his Security Legislation Directorate (SLD) file obtained through a Promotion to Access of Information Act (PAIA) request, and a collection of letters donated by Jane Harris. Materials in each series have been described on item level.

The materials contained in the police docket kept on John Harris (series A), the John Harris trial records (series B), his court exhibit file (series C), prison files (series D and D1) and media file (series E) form the bulk of the collection. Copies of the police investigation file and the court transcripts were obtained from the SAPS Museum in Pretoria. The prison files and court exhibit file were obtained from the Department of Correctional Services Archive at Pretoria Central Prison. Most of the documents are photocopies of the original documentation. Materials in the court exhibit file and the two prison files have been digitised by Specialised Archival Solution in 2009 and are only available in digital format.

Materials obtained from the SAPS Museum and the archive of the Department of Correctional Services were secured by SAHA on behalf of John Harris's family, and donated to SAHA by his son, David Wolfe in 2009.

A copy of John Harris's Security Legislation Directorate (SLD) file was released to SAHA by the National Archives in respect of PAIA request number 0064/NAR/2008, and is archived in the Freedom of Information Programme (FOIP) collection as AL2878\_B1.3.6.9, and cross-referenced and described in series F of the John Harris collection.

Letters written by John Harris to his sister Jane whilst in prison (1964-1965) were donated by Jane Harris to SAHA. In 2014 Jane Harris requested the return of the original letters to the family. To replace the original letters she donated ring-bound photocopies of the letters. The photocopied letters are contained in series G.

F: Security Legislation Directorate (SLD) file of Frederick John Harris [1963-1965]

A copy of this SLD file was released to SAHA by the National Archives in respect of PAIA request number 0064/NAR/2008, and is archived in the Freedom of Information Programme (FOIP) collection as AL2878\_B1.3.6.9. The materials in this folder give insight into John Harris's political activities in the years leading up to the bomb explosion. Although described in chronological order, the materials are kept in their original reverse order.

### [1964-1965]

The collection of original 60 hand-written letters was donated to SAHA by Jane Harris in October 2012. The letters, dated from 15 September 1964 to 23 March 1965 were written by John Harris whilst in prison for the Johannesburg station bomb explosion on 24 July 1964 which killed an elderly woman and injured 23 people. He was convicted of murder and was hanged on 1 April 1965, aged 27. The last letter in this series was written a week before his death.

The original letters were replaced by bound photocopies of letters after Jane Harris requested the return of the original letters to the family in 2014.

- G1: Letter written on 15 September 1964 This letter was written by John Harris on 15 September 1964 and is addressed to his sister Jane and her then husband Drew. The date the letter was released by the prison is illegible.
